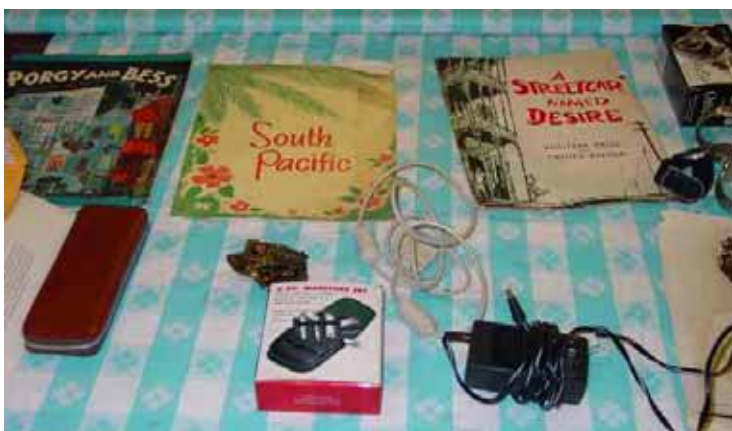
FROM YOUR EDITOR: Well it has been an interesting month. I made a short plane ride to the Cleveland Clinic, Ohio. Only 40 minutes from Philly. I am supposed to go back in Sept. for another check-up, and then a decision will be made. Can you imagine a hospital that handles 8,000 patients a day, and with employees over 30,000. Well that is what I was told about "The Clinic". They handle 125 heart operations five days a week. Over 19 blocks this place took up, they even have there own police force. Robin Williams, the comedian just left there with open heart surgery.

Needless to say I came back very relieved and impressed, and was told "Mr. Tripet, you don't worry about your anyserisum, it is the size of a 45mm bullet, the next time you come back we will decide what t do. And that you will be in the best of care." That little bullet had me concerned; as long as it won't break I will be OK. Can you imagine taking a Cat Scan in 5 minutes? I have had them here an average time of 1 hour.

I met people from all over the US and the world who went there for a procedure or staying there waiting to have a procedure. With many hospitals not making out financially, I wonder, they were still building. So one wonders how they can do it. Management I guess.

I walked north, east, south and west an average of four blocks each way and all I seen was Cleveland Clinic buildings. I also seen six parking garages at least a block long and an average of eight stories high. Shuttle busses all over the place. An amazing place for sure.

<<<<<< Height Bottle Markings 11 3/8" tall, 4 1/2" wide oval bottle embossed "Quart Full Measure" Description, including signature and date

A bartender and two patrons stand in the "John Neubauer SALOON". There are two rows of liquor bottles and labels in the bar and four trees at the sides. Although there is no sign saying "Find the Missing Man" as some bar bottles have, there is a "missing man" under the floor. The construction is signed on the back: "[Carl Worner](#)". This bottle is not dated but can be placed in Chicago, c1900-1920, where the Neubauer saloon was.

Length Bottle Markings 10 1/2" long, >>>>>>
5 1/2" tall bottle broke, but it was a large seltzer or "bar" bottle Description, including signature and date Four bakers, whose paper hat crowns are missing, work at ovens while rows of rolls and breads line the front counter. There is even a wedding cake with a bride and groom on top. The sign over the bakery reads "P. Boevers Bakery". Most of the items in the bakery are labeled in English, but one labeled "Zinment", almost Cinnamon in German (Zimt).



The construction is signed on the bottom: "[Carl Wörner Maker](#)" and "Gemacht bei Hermann Domke Bäkersgeselle" (in old German script, which translates as "Made at the home of Hermann Domke, journeyman baker"). It is dated "1907/2" probably meaning February 1907. Paul Boevers had a bakery in Maywood, IL, a suburb of Chicago, in the 1910 census



<<<Height Bottle Markings c11" tall slightly oval quart bottle, no markings Description, including signature and date

This bottle was made by Carl Worner in St. Louis in 1915. It features the shoe shop of Rudolph Casper and Adolphe Gloor and shows two shoe-makers at work. Behind them is a sewing machine and above their heads is a shelf of shoes. Shoes also hang from the walls. The construction is signed on the back: "[Carl Worner](#)", and dated 1915
